FROM THE PASTOR...

My first few weeks here at St. Francis Parish have really flown by. I'm beginning to know a few names and I am getting to know the shortcuts around the neighborhood. I again want to thank you all for the very warm welcome that I have received. I truly appreciate your kindness.

This past week Father Joe and I, along with the Religious Education coordinators, began doing preliminary interviews with the young people who will be beginning the Confirmation Program this year. We hope to be able to get to know them a little bit so that we can work closely with them and their parents and teachers in preparing for this important sacrament.

This weekend's second collection is the parish "ongoing maintenance" collection and you may wonder how these funds are used. Over the past few years, through the generosity of many parishioners, a great investment has been made in improving and renovating the parish buildings. In order to protect that investment, we have to be very attentive to keeping them in good condition. For example, weather and dampness had taken their toll on the outside of the rectory causing mildew and peeling paint. Over the past couple of weeks we have had painters here to power clean the rectory, re-paint the trim and seal and stain the shingles. This work should protect the material and appearance of the rectory for a number of years. The finance council agrees that it is very important for us to monitor these maintenance needs and we are in the process of developing a long term plan for the ongoing maintenance of the entire property. As time goes by I will keep you informed about maintenance projects as they are planned and accomplished.

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE ROMAN MISSAL

While we are still thirteen weeks away from the full implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal, you will notice some changes to the *sung* musical settings at Mass. At their most recent general meeting, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to permit the early implementation of the sung revised translations beginning in September (this includes the "Holy, Holy, Holy" and the "Mystery of Faith," which is sung immediately after the consecration). We have been practicing the new settings before Mass and will begin to use them during Mass beginning in September. The remainder of the newly translated Missal will be implemented, according to the original plan, on November 27, 2011. As we make more significant strides in implementing the new translation, we appreciate your patience. Change is never easy! Nonetheless, the Celebration of Mass is absolutely central to our faith and our mission as a parish, and hopefully this time of transition will allow us to grow in our knowledge and our love of the Church's greatest prayer.

IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

In his letter to the Romans, Saint Paul urges his readers "to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship." Saint Paul makes it clear that

there must be a material element to worship. Human beings are not simply spiritual creatures. We are also embodied, rooted firmly in the material world. God has willed that earthly realities help us express interior dispositions, and in the sacramental economy, material signs are used to effect the grace they signify. pouring of water, the anointing with oil, the laying-on of hands, etc., actually make something happen! They are not empty rituals. And in the greatest of sacraments, the Holy Eucharist, the material elements themselves (the bread and wine) are actually transformed into the body and blood of Christ. What a mystery indeed! Saint Paul's insight remains an important one. We are embodied creatures, planted firmly in this material reality of ours, and God chooses to meet us "on our own terms" by using earthly elements that speak to us in a comprehensible way. Water signifies cleansing, oil signifies strengthening, bread and wine signify fortification and nourishment. Such is God's love for us, that he desires we encounter him in ways that we can understand and appreciate. By allowing grace to transform our souls, our bodies are drawn up into God's saving plan as well. So "do not conform yourselves to this age," Saint Paul warns, an age that devalues the transcendent significance of material reality, "but be transformed" by your participation in the sacramental life of the Church!

FATHER GREENAN CENTER

Fr. Greenan Center is truly a gem! Few parishes can boast such a spacious, historic and architecturally intriguing space for parish use. As you know, the third floor of Fr. Greenan Center is in the process of being converted into the "Upper Room," a space for our parish teens. With the exception of a flat-screen television and a game table, everything else is in place! Additionally, the space immediately below the Upper Room, and at the center back of the upper hall, is in the process of being converted into a parish library. The parish received a significant donation of theological and philosophical books that we hope to make available to our parishioners. More on that in the upcoming weeks! In addition to providing new services to our parish family (a youth room and a library), these newly utilized spaces will also serve as additional rooms for parish meetings and functions.
