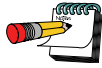

CELIAC DISEASE

Anyone who lives with Celiac Disease and is unable to receive the consecrated host because of that condition, should be aware that we have available special low-gluten hosts. These hosts have been favorably reviewed by the publication "Gluten Free Living" as 'perfectly safe' for sufferers of Celiac Disease. Here is what "Gluten Free Living" had to say about the hosts we use:

The measurement cited here, 0.01%, represents 100 PPMs (parts per million). But the more important number is 37 micrograms, because it is daily exposure to gluten that counts. The best current information shows that 10 milligrams a day should be safe. / Ten milligrams is the same as 10,000 micrograms. If you divide 37 micrograms into 10,000 micrograms, you will find that you would have to eat 270 wafers every day to reach the danger point. At most, celiacs would consume one wafer per day or about 0.04% (four tenths of one percent) of the amount considered dangerous.

We ask, that at least 10 minutes prior to Mass, you make yourself known to the celebrant and request the low-gluten host. Be sure to go to the priest for Communion, who will have the low-gluten host in his paten.

Twilight Retreat: Follow-Up

The pattern of their journey is the same pattern of every Mass: we acknowledge our brokenness, we hear God's story unfold in the readings, we make a bold profession of faith, we experience Communion with Christ, and we are sent on a mission to invite others to know and love him! The Memorial of Saint Dominic

Monday, August 8 is observed as the memorial of Saint Dominic de Guzman, the thirteenth century priest and founder of the Order of Friars Preachers, more commonly known as "the Dominicans." Saint Dominic was exposed as a young priest to the heresy of "Albigensianism" which led its adherents to despise their flesh and bodily existence. Saint Dominic vigorously preached against this heresy, pointing to the "Incarnational" nature of authentic Christian spirituality. Since the second person of the Trinity, the Eternal Word, assumed human flesh and entered into this material world of ours, bodily existence must never be considered evil! Saint Dominic realized that much of the confusion surrounding this heresy was a lack of proper formation in authentic Christian doctrine. So Saint Dominic, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, began an order of preachers who would travel throughout the world spreading sound doctrine through their preaching. Saint Dominic's young order blossomed and quickly spread throughout all of Europe. The Dominican family includes the greatest intellectual light of the Catholic tradition, Saint Thomas Aquinas. The Dominican order continues to flourish today, even in our own area, where the Dominican Fathers own and operate Providence College. Pope Benedict said of Saint Dominic: "Dominic, who wished to found a religious Order of theologian-preachers, reminds us that theology has a spiritual and pastoral dimension that enriches the soul and life...This great Saint reminds us that in the heart of the Church a missionary fire must always burn" (General Audience of February 3, 2010). Following the example of Saint Dominic, may we never fail to preach the gospel "in season and out of season"! Saint Dominic, pray for us!

IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

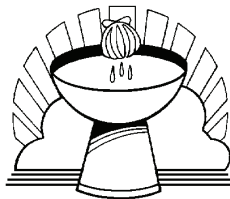
In today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings, Elijah encounters the Living God in a most unexpected way. God is not found in all the expected places, like the heavy wind, the earthquake, and the fire. God made himself known to Elijah in humility, by a small, whispering breeze. God's presence in the liturgy is similar to that. God comes to us in humility. Jesus didn't make any grand gestures at the last supper. He took humble bread and simple wine and gave them to his friends to eat and drink. Jesus does the same for us. The simple bread and wine at Mass truly become the body and blood of Jesus. The most ordinary of human elements becomes the most extraordinary of gifts. Jesus doesn't come to us in pomp and flare. He comes hidden under the appearance of food and drink. He also comes to us in the power of his Word, which often goes in one ear and out the other. The Second Vatican Council taught that the presence of Christ is to be revered in the Sacred Scriptures, as well as his presence in the Eucharist. How often do we hear the readings without really listening? God might have something important to say to us, and we might expect to find him in the most obvious places. But maybe he's got something to say that isn't so obvious! Maybe, through our faithful and attentive participation in the liturgy, God will surprise us with a small whispering breeze!
