


NEED FOR CATECHISTS AND AIDES

INTRODUCING A PARISH COURSE:



JESUS OF NAZARETH

Of his many contributions to the church throughout his long life of service, Joseph Ratzinger (Pope-Emeritus Benedict XVI) produced a trilogy of books on the identity, life and mission of Jesus Christ. As our parish concludes our observance of the Year of Faith in November, it is fitting that we

seek to learn together more about Jesus, who is the leader and perfecter of our faith. Please consider joining us for a seven-week course on Volume One of *Jesus of Nazareth* that will meet regularly throughout the Fall. This course is intended for beginners, and no prior study is required. We will read the book independently and will gather together with Fr. Joe who will "unpack" the highlights of each chapter, offering an exposition of the major themes and insights. (Fr. Joe uses this book as the basis for his course at Prout on the gospels.) This course is not a "bible study" per se, although the figure and teaching of Jesus as presented by all four gospel writers will be examined. In order to offer the course, we need at least ten committed participants.

Aside from the cost of the book, there is no fee to participate. Please call the rectory for more information or contact Mary Vitiello at maryalri@yahoo.com. Be advised that this sevenweek course will take the place of our regular Fall parish bible study.
