
# From the Pastor

On the weekend *after* Labor Day, that is, on the weekend of September 10-11, we'll return to the usual "winter" Mass schedule: at the church, 4:30, 8, 10, noon; at the chapel, 10 a.m. only. Until then, through the Labor Day weekend, we'll continue the "summer" schedule of six Masses.

As of this writing (Tuesday morning) we have collected over \$20,000 from the loyal St. Romuald's community toward a new roof for the chapel. We can only hope that those who attend the parish church will show themselves as generous when we come to replace the boiler before the cold weather returns. The boiler will cost in the \$50,000-\$55,000 range and we've been told that the one we have now is unusable and cannot be restarted. Between the parking lot, the chapel roof, and the church boiler, we shall have spent around \$150,000 just on buildings and maintenance in one calendar year. I can't thank enough all of you who support the parish financially. Your generosity makes it possible for this "Mother Church of South County" to continue.

And speaking of generosity: I am very proud of our support of the Catholic Charity Fund. This year we went nearly 20% over our assigned goal. To me, this shows that our concern is not just with buildings and property but also with service to people in need. God bless all who show their faith and love in concrete deeds! Generous people make the world a better place.
