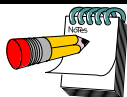

Family Liturgies 2013-2014

What is a "Family Liturgy" at St. Francis?

Once a month at St. Francis Church, the 10:00AM Mass is designated as a special "Family Liturgy" with a homily geared principally to

the children, although not without value for the adults present! The Family Liturgies are planned to coincide with the liturgical seasons or other catechetical themes that can be easily reinforced at home or in religious education classes. Please note the dates and themes below as we look forward to another school year.

Sunday, September 15, 10AM – Open the Door of Faith (Catechetical Sunday)

- *A day to reflect on the importance of passing on our faith to our young people and to commission our parish catechists.*

Sunday, October 20, 10AM – Mass of Belonging

- *Although all children and families are welcome at this special liturgy, we will welcome in a special way the First Communion children as they begin the process of preparation that will lead to their reception of Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time in the Spring.*

Sunday, November 3, 10AM – Parade of Little Saints

- *To coincide with the Solemnity of All Saints, all children will be encouraged to dress as their favorite saint and some will even be "interviewed" during the homily!*

Sunday, December 15, 10AM – Advent Family Liturgy

- *A day to reflect on the importance of the Advent Season through the symbol of the Advent Wreath, and to prepare our hearts to receive Christ at Christmas.*

Sunday, January 12, 10AM – Mass of Listening to God's Word

- *Geared specifically to our First Communion children, but open to all families, we will reflect in this Liturgy on the importance of hearing God's Word before we receive his Sacrament.*

Sunday, February 9, 10AM – The Strength of Jesus's Love

- *As we look ahead to Valentine's Day, we will reflect on the power of Christ's love for us.*

Sunday, March 9, 10AM – Lenten Family Liturgy

- *A day to reflect on the meaning of the Lenten Season and to bury the "alleluia" until Easter.*

Sunday, April 6, 10AM – Approaching Holy Week

- *A day to reflect on the meaning and significance of the holiest week of the year.*

Sunday, May 4, 10AM – May Crowning

- *A day to honor our Blessed Mother as Queen of Heaven and Earth, and to learn about her important role in our lives.*

Letter from the Mahoney family

When we settled down in South Kingstown over 17 years ago, we knew it was a great little town with a wonderful school system, close to the beaches, family oriented and safe. What we didn't know were the amazing people we would encounter as we raised our children and made our lives here. We are part of a wonderful community: the South Kingstown school system, St. Francis of Assisi parish, Rams swimming club, and many more work, neighborhood, and beach friends.

This past March, our family was faced with a major health crisis. My husband Sean had a brain tumor that was bleeding. It was a tumor that had metastasized from his lung. We started along a journey filled with words such as stage four lung cancer, brain metastases, hemi paresis, chemotherapy, and radiation. Our loving community stepped in to walk this path along side of us. Offers of help poured in. Meals were left at our doorstep. Rides were given to my son and mother. The kind deeds and support are too numerous to mention, but know that our entire family has felt your arms helping to carry us through.

On Sunday, August 11, a 5k(ish) walk was held at Curtis Corner Middle School bike path to support Sean and our family. Words cannot describe the overwhelming love and generous spirit we experienced that morning from our little town. This event was spearheaded by some special buddies and helped along by an army of friends, the West Kingston Elementary School family, adult, teen, and kid volunteers, walkers, runners, and bikers from every corner of our community. Thank you are such small words and don't seem adequate to express the feelings of love and gratitude we feel to each and every one of you, but thank you.

We would also like to give our gratitude to the businesses who gave generous donations to help make this event successful. Thank you to Pier Ice, Java Madness, Pier Pizza, Staples, Shaws, Belmont Market, and Panera Bread. Also, thank you to the South Kingstown police department for providing a police detail to ensure the safety of all the walk participants.

We are so blessed to live in this beautiful town with loving friends.
