

From the Pastor,

The presence of the religious orders in the Church is a challenge to all of us to remember the values of the gospel. Religious vows like poverty, chastity and obedience are traditionally known as "evangelical counsels." Most of us need to maintain property, to educate children, to make some preparation for the future, and so forth. But the religious life is an attempt to imitate the early Christian community in which St. Luke tells us, "<u>All who believed</u> were together and had all things in common; they would sell their property and possessions and divide them among all according to each one's need." (Acts of the Apostles 2:44-45)

The religious life remains a reminder to the rest of us to put things in perspective. The vow of poverty challenges us not to make money and material possessions the be-all and end-all of our lives. The vow of chastity calls us to the proper use of sexuality according to our state in life, whether married or unmarried. The vow of obedience is a challenge to us to consider whether we really need to have our own way in everything. Certainly, it calls all of us to consider the law of God when making decisions.

We are blessed in our parish with the presence of two religious orders: the Sisters of the Cross and Passion (CP), who used to staff our parish school, and the Sisters of Divine Providence (CDP), whose international mother house is here on Christopher Street.

There are also at least two other former parishioners who are members of other orders: Sister Pia Meehan, a Capuchin Sister of Nazareth, and Sr. Kelli Rose McNulty, who is now in formation to become a cloistered sister in the convent of the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary.

This weekend, Sister Madeline Pucella, CP, a native of our parish, celebrates 70 years in the vowed life. We pray for her and her community and for all who have dedicated themselves to the service of God and his people in the religious life. We continue to pray for vocations to the vowed life and to the priesthood that the work of the Gospel may go forward for the good of society and the glory of God.
