

From the Pastor,

On Saturday, June 30, the Diocese of Providence will ordain one young man to the priesthood, Philip Dufour, who has been studying at the North American College in Rome, and who was ordained to the diaconate last fall. I am happy to announce that the bishop has chosen our parish for his summer assignment before he returns to Rome for one more year to complete his Licentiate in Sacred Theology, after which he'll receive a full-time assignment somewhere here in Rhode Island.

Here is a message he sent from Rome for our bulletin:

I am Deacon Phillip Dufour. I grew up in Bristol, RI and attended Our Lady of Mount Carmel School, before moving on to Bishop Stang High School in North Dartmouth, MA. In 2010, I entered Our Lady of Providence Seminary and began studying at Providence College, graduating in 2014 with a B.A. in Philosophy. Later that year, I was sent by Bishop Tobin to the Pontifical North American College in Rome for theological studies. I received my S.T.B. in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in June of 2017. In September of 2017, I was ordained a transitional deacon by Bishop James Checchio, Bishop of Metuchen, NJ, at the Papal Basilica of St. Peter.

On June 30th, 2018, Bishop Thomas Tobin will ordain me to the priesthood at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul. Currently, I am pursuing a licentiate in Sacred Theology (S.T.L.) in Spiritual Theology at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas and will return to Rome in September to complete my studies. I enjoy spending time with family and friends, reading, studying history, skiing, and tennis. I thank Bishop Tobin and Fr. Bodah for the opportunity to be a part of this parish community. I look forward to meeting you all and to soon be serving you as one of your parish priests. God bless you all!

As you recall, we were blessed last summer with the ministry of Fr. Nathan Ricci, who is finishing his license in Canon Law and will be coming home in June to begin his permanent assignment. We pray for soon-to-be Father Dufour that he will be equally a blessing to us and we to him as he begins his first priestly assignment!

Elementary School Tuition Aid Final Reminder: Deadline April 30

Now is the time to turn in tuition assistance applications for the **2018-2019** school year. If you have not yet received your forms from the school, please call the school and inquire about them.

Regarding Catholic School Assistance:

The Diocese of Providence urges all parishes to support Catholic Schools by giving aid, as far as possible, when parents request it. As believers in the value of Catholic Schools, we are happy to do that, both to the fullest extent allowable, and to the extent that the parish can afford. Some things to note, however! Eligibility for consideration requires that families:

- 1. Complete the Facts Form from the Catholic School Office. (No applications will be considered if the Facts Form has not been completed)
- 2. You must be registered parishioners of St. Francis of Assisi Parish & contributing members for at least a one year period.
- 3. Attend Mass regularly.
- 4. Be actively involved in St. Francis of Assisi parish life.
- 5. All requests are to be turned into the parish office, whether your child has been accepted or not, <u>no later</u> than April 30.
