



## From the Pastor

We have begun the Holy Week observances. Palm Sunday leads to the Sacred Triduum: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil of Saturday night. Here's a reflection from the Dominican Father Romanus Cessario on the betrayal of the Lord that took place on Holy Thursday.

No one wants to experience betrayal, especially when the betrayer is a close companion. Betrayal ruptures friendship. Friends constantly wish each other some good. Friendship indeed can only flourish when it is based on a shared good thing, like the pleasure of visiting a museum, or the utility of a valued assistant, or—in friendship's best expression—the person who is our friend. The betrayer exchanges good for bad, and so reveals himself as an enemy, not a friend.

On the night he was betrayed, Jesus confronted his enemy.

As the New Testament makes plain, Jesus knew the one *who would betray him.* Still, he washes the feet of Judas, son of Simon the Iscariot. In this ritual foot washing, Jesus enacts his own commandment: *I say to you, love your enemies...that you may be children of* 



*your heavenly Father* (Mt 5:44a, 45a). Jesus also offers the promise of forgiveness to his betrayer. Sadly, Judas missed the cue.



Each time we sin, we betray the love of friendship that unites us to God. Venial sins—those everyday human weaknesses weaken the gift of divine friendship, whereas mortal sins destroy it. On Holy Thursday, Christ ordains the first priests. He gives them the sacred power and the authority to

forgive sins. From that moment on, we sinners never need fear dying at enmity with God.
