From the Pastor

This Tuesday is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day of obligation. Masses will be celebrated in the church at 7 a.m. and at noon, and at the chapel at 6:30 P.M. There is no vigil Mass.

Here are some reflections on this feast from Pope Benedict, Pope St. John Paul II, and St. Ambrose Autpert, an 8th century Benedictine monk:

Pope Benedict XVI wrote that "precisely because Mary is with God and in God, she is very close to each one of us. While she lived on this earth she could only be close to a a few people. Being in God, who is actually 'within' all of us, Mary shares in this closeness of God." Our Lady "knows our hearts, can hear our prayers, can help us with her motherly kindness. She always listens to us, and, being Mother of the Son, participates in the power of the Son and in his goodness. We can always entrust the whole of our lives to this Mother." The Blessed Mother's birth into heaven generates in us "an ever new capacity to await God's future" (Saint John Paull II). "Mary lifted herself up to such lofty heights of heaven that the Word reached down from the highest pinnacle of heaven and took her in" (A. Autpert).

O Mary, Mother of hope, strong with your help, we do not fear obstacles and difficulties; fatigue and sufferings do not discourage us, because you accompany us on the path of life, and from heaven you watch over all your children, filling them with grace. To you we entrust the destiny of the peoples and the mission of the Church....

Dear brothers and sisters, however dark the shadows that sometimes gather on the horizon and however incomprehensible certain events may appear to be in human history, we must never lose trust and peace. Today's feast invites us to entrust ourselves to Mary assumed into heaven who, like a shining star from heaven, directs our daily journey on earth. (Saint John Paul II)


Featured in August: CATECHESIS

Jesus commands us in the Great Commission to teach the nations to observe "all that I have commanded you..." [Matthew 28:20]. But, what exactly is that body of teaching? The Catechism tells us that "the apostles entrusted the 'Sacred deposit' of the faith contained in Sacred Scripture and Tradition, to the whole of the Church" (CCC 84). In other words, the body of saving truth entrusted by Christ to the Apostles and handed on by them to be preserved and proclaimed is what we call the Deposit of Faith. St. John Paul II wrote that every Catholic has the right to receive this Deposit of Faith "not in mutilated, falsified or diminished form but whole and entire, in all its rigor and vigor" (Catechesi tradendae 30). Truly, every Catholic deserves to know their story and we need to be enthusiastic to share it with them!
