From the Pastor

What's in the works? I have been concerned about the appearance of the interior of the church for some time. It's been almost 20 years since it's been attended to and I think you'll agree that it's high time we looked into getting a new paint job, cleaning the woodwork and the stained glass, replacing the carpets, and maybe refinishing the pews.

Our loyal parishioner Ed Rudegeair, who's been a great help in overseeing many of the projects for the physical plants, met with a painting company to get a preliminary bid. The painting alone was estimated at over \$100,000. Scaffolding will have to be erected and we would lose the use of the church for at least one weekend. Still, sooner or later it's got to be done, no?

As you may have seen in the RI Catholic, the diocese is planning a major campaign for the near future, spread over four years. Our parish is scheduled to be in the group for the spring of 2018 and our goal will be something like \$500,000. The good news is that 40% of the money raised will return to the parishes. That would mean, presuming we reach our goal, that \$200,000 would be available to spruce up the interior of the church and perhaps put something aside for the future. So, after consulting the parish finance council, I've decided to postpone the work on the church till we get the campaign off the ground. Fear not! We will not let this beautiful church go uncared for. More about this in the future.

One of the great efforts in any parish is its program of religious education. Barbette Cullen and Diane Castro really give their all in providing catechesis and faith formation to the children and youth of the parish. Of course, this could not be done without the generous help of many volunteer teachers and aides. We have always been able to count on parents and other parishioners to come forward and pitch in for this worthy cause. 


HOLIDAY—NO ADORATION/PARISH OFFICES CLOSED

In the liturgy, Advent is a Marian time: the time when Mary made room in her womb for the Savior of the world and bore within her humanity's hope and expectation. Celebrating Advent means becoming Marian, imitating Mary's unconditional 'Yes' which is ever anew the place of God's birth, the 'fullness of time'" — Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger
