The situation with the propane in the Greenan Center has been taken care of and our insurance will cover the costs, including the loss of the 700 gallons that leaked into the air. Thanks be to the dear Lord that things weren't much worse.

In response to the announcement that we would need defibrillators for our buildings, four people have come forward to donate them. So we shall be able to have one in the church, one on each floor of the Greenan Center, and one at the chapel. God bless the donors for their generosity. A couple of the devices have been donated in memory of deceased family members and I'll be able to say more about that in the future.

Our search for a new parish organist and Director of Music Ministry has resulted in the hiring of Mr. Tony B. Romeo. Tony comes to us highly recommended. He has been working in Springfield, Massachusetts, and is relocating to the South County area. Because of obligations to his present parish, he will not begin playing here until the fourth Sunday of Advent, and so will be with us for Christmas.
