


Elementary School Tuition Aid

Now is the time to turn in tuition assistance applications for the **2017-2018** school year. If you have not yet received your forms from the school, please call the school and inquire about them.

Regarding Catholic School Assistance:

The Diocese of Providence urges all parishes to support Catholic Schools by giving aid, as far as possible, when parents request it. As a believer in the value of Catholic Schools, we are happy to do that, both to the fullest extent allowable, and to the extent that the parish can afford. Some things to note, however! Eligibility for consideration requires that families:

- 1. Complete the Facts Form from the Catholic School Office.
- 2. You must be registered parishioners of St. Francis of Assisi Parish & contributing members for at least a one year period.
- 3. Attend Mass regularly.
- 4. Be actively involved in St. Francis of Assisi parish life.
- 5. All requests are to be turned into the parish office, whether your child has been accepted or not, by April 30.

From the Pastor

This week we received a communication from the diocese that a bill has been introduced to the legislature that would extend and protect the practice of abortion in all circumstances and remove any consideration for the children developing in their mothers' wombs. We have been asked to encourage all those eligible to vote in our area to contact their representatives and urge them to oppose House Bill #5343.

By way of clarification I should point out that the people who sponsor this bill are much too clever to state outright that it would allow "partial birth abortion" or allow legal abortion at any time until birth, but the bill would ensure that an abortion can be performed up to the point that *the individual doctor and his patient* decide that the developing child would be viable outside the womb. In other words, if the doctor and the woman announce that they believe a child is not viable until after natural birth, they may proceed with the abortion at any time without fear of legal repercussion.

The telephone numbers for the Representatives for this part of the state— Kathleen A. Fogarty, Teresa A. Tanzi, and Carol Hagan McEntee—can be found at vote.sos.ri.gov or by calling (401)222-2340. There are also some flyers at the doors of the church and chapel containing their phone numbers and other relevant information, as well as a statement from the Rhode Island Catholic Conference affirming the integrity of the Church's stance on war, capital punishment, euthanasia, health care, poverty, and immigration as "prolife."
