From the Pastor

As one year ends and another begins, I'd like to say a word of thanks to the parish staff for their year-round service to all of us.

Deacon Patrick Moynihan, although his work with the Haitian Project frequently keeps him away, has done all the baptisms, with their attendant preparation, which has been an invaluable help to me. He has also been able to preach on several occasions: always a nice change for everyone.

Christina Moynihan, the parish Pastoral Assistant, has done a monumental job in providing so many opportunities for people to get more involved in parish life. She has spent many hours preparing for several series of talks and events, for example: the family Masses with their receptions; the Better Part series on spiritual formation; the Affairs of the Arts series, drawing on the skills of our parishioners. All these in addition to her work behind the scenes such as visiting the sick and shut-ins, arranging for and working with Bonnie Ingalls and others on the landscaping around the statue of Our Lady outside the church. Barbette Cullen and Diane Castro have overseen the catechesis of our younger parishioners for years. Anyone who has had children in our religious education program can testify to their tireless work and their upbeat spirits.

Stephen Higgins and Karen Graham are directors of music at the church and the chapel respectively. Probably no one has a greater impact on the quality of our liturgical celebrations except the celebrants. We are blessed to have two excellent musicians who serve us faithfully each weekend and provide music for all our weddings and funerals.

Bill Harding, although he attends all our biweekly staff meetings, gives all his time in running the chapel as a gift to the parish. Space does not permit me to sing Bill's praises for all he does for our parish even beyond running the chapel, including bringing communion to the sick.

Last but certainly not least is Ute Porcelli, the rectory housekeeper.
