

From the Pastor,


The defibrillators have arrived, thanks to the generosity of parishioners, and will be installed in the church, the chapel and the Father Greenan Center. Roberta Grundy was the first to come forward to donate one in memory of her husband, James A. Grundy; Lisa Rodier followed right after and donated one in memory of her father, Robert Rodier; Caroline Pucella Brown donated one in memory of her husband, Bob Brown. The defibrillator for St. Romuald's was donated by someone who wishes to remain anonymous.

Now we need people trained to use them. If you've been trained, or if you wish to be trained, please call the rectory and give us your contact information so that we can arrange for training sessions. If you can help with the training, please let us know that as well. God bless the work!

There has also been some question about the "Perpetual Mass Association." Over the last few years, several parishioners have left large bequests to the parish. In gratitude, we put a small portion of it amounting to \$5,000 per person, into a special endowment held by the diocese which will be used to pay for Masses for these generous donors. The original three were unmarried, and although one of them had nieces and nephews who have her remembered at the altar from time to time, none of the three donors had any children of their own to perpetuate their memories in the church.

So far, the Association consists of Laura Webb, Edna Otto, and Marilyn Maley, but it is open to all who would like to remember the parish in their wills. There are many pious and faithful Catholics whose families will not think or sometimes even care to have them remembered at the altar. This is a way of ensuring that their souls will be commended to the Lord throughout the year and their names held in remembrance in the parish.


