From the Pastor

Let me revise something I wrote last week. There *will* be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as usual on Monday morning, but it will end at 11 a.m. instead of at noon so that we can prepare for the noon Mass at the chapel in Matunuck in honor of its patron, St. Romuald.

This weekend's Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ is a good time to recommit ourselves as Catholics to the Holy Eucharist. The Mass begins with the entrance hymn and ends with the dismissal, "Go in peace" or similar words. 
