From the Pastor

This past Monday, a group of nearly 100 people assembled in the Father Greenan Center to hear Professor Sandra Keating of Providence College introduce us to the essential points of Islam. What is Sharia? What are Shiites and how are they different from Sunnis? What about the place of women in the Islamic tradition. What are the Five Pillars of the religion? To what did it owe its remarkable success in spreading itself from Iran to the border of Spain with France in less than a century? Of course, we could only skim the surface of all this, and religions always look different to those who hold them from those who see them from the outside. Still, the hour and a half was well-spent and we gained a greater appreciation of this religion of over a billion people who profess a belief in one God, "the Merciful, the Compassionate, the Ruler of Judgment Day." Dr. Keating also spoke of the Muslims' respect for the Mother of Jesus, pointing out that the Koran says more about her than does the New Testament. Certainly, Muslims make pilgrimages to Fatima and to other Marian shrines. Perhaps the Blessed Mother will be a way we can find some common ground between our two religions, which believe in the oneness of God but which in many other respects hold incompatible beliefs. Manv thanks to Christina Moynihan for arranging this event and to Diane Castro, Barbette Cullen and Bobby Kelly for setting up and lending their assistance to make this so successful.

Elsewhere in the news: Don't miss out on the debut of *The Annunciation Symphony* by Dr. Enrico Garzilli, this Sunday at 3pm in the church. This work for organ and voice of about 50 minutes in length, celebrates the conception of our Lord at the coming of the Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary. A reception will follow downstairs in the Helen Bouchard Hall.

Also, don't forget the food drive to support the Jonnycake Center of Peace Dale and the Welcome House shelter for the homeless.

The Catholic Charity Fund appeal continues apace.

And finally, the parish Pastoral Council will meet on Monday at 7 p.m. in the rectory meeting room to discuss ways to ensure the growth and solid future of our parish.


