

From the Pastor,

There are innumerable ways of praying. The Baltimore Catechism used the definition of St. John of Damascus: "Prayer is a lifting up of the mind and heart to God." Prayer is also always a *response* to the activity of the Holy Spirit within us: God always takes the initiative.

One of the motives of prayer is *intercession*, that is, prayer for the needs of others. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "Christian intercession participates in Christ's, as an expression of the communion of saints. In intercession, those who pray look 'not only to their own interests, but also to the interests of others,' even to the point of praying for those who do them harm."

If we are to pray even for our enemies, how much more should we pray for our families, our friends and our fellow Christians? Priests and many religious are obliged by their state in life to pray the "Liturgy of the Hours" also known as the Divine Office or the Work of God or even the Breviary, for the Church, the world, for all the living and the dead. But all the members of the Church are privileged to join the prayer of Christ as he intercedes for us at the right hand of the Father.

In a few weeks, each of our Mass-goers will be asked to take a prayer card home and pray a parish prayer especially for the three families whose names will be on your card. I can't imagine that anyone could object to praying that God would bless our fellow parishioners and our whole parish community. The New Testament says, "The fervent prayer of a righteous person is very powerful." (James 5:16b)

Will you become a "Prayer Warrior" for the good of others? Others will be praying for you..
