# From the Pastor,

Another mass shooting; this time in Texas. A few weeks ago Father Randall preached a homily at the 8 o'clock Mass at which he challenged today's society for the way it forms us to put ourselves first and to believe that we are not responsible to any common good or even to any authority outside ourselves, not even to the God who revealed himself to the world and who speaks to us through the tradition of the Church, especially the Sacred Scriptures. Something to think about.

In response to these not-infrequent shootings, there has been much talk about the second amendment to the US constitution. Has anyone actually read it? It is not simply about "the right to bear arms" as if that were all there was to it. This is what it says, "A well regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed."

The decisions of the Supreme Court on this subject have been as bizarre to a non-lawyer like myself as much of what they have decided from Dred Scott to Roe v. Wade. In District of Columbia v. Heller (2008), the Court ruled that the Second Amendment "codified a pre-existing right" and that it "protects an individual right to possess a firearm unconnected with service in a militia, and to use that arm for traditionally lawful purposes, such as self-defense within the home" but also stated that "the right is not unlimited. It is not a right to keep and carry any weapon whatsoever in any manner whatsoever and for whatever purpose." So the reasoning of the Founding Fathers—that the right to bear arms follows upon the need for a well-regulated militia for public defensewas rejected by the Supreme Court in 2008 in a five to four decision along party line, the so-called "strict constructionists" rejecting the plain reasoning of the original text. Hmm.

Is it time to rethink the second amendment and repeal it as written so that we the people can decide what is needed in the present age for our security and peace?


