From the Pastor,

Well, it's official! As of this writing on Tuesday, November 13, we have surpassed our parish goal of \$626,000 for the Grateful for God's Providence diocesan campaign by more than \$100,000. That means that in addition to the 40% of the \$626,000, the parish will get back 60% of that \$100,000+ and of anything we collect over that. Nearly 200 households have participated, God bless them! If you have not already pledged or made an outright gift, please consider doing so. It'll be helpful to the parish but also good for your soul. "Give and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." (Luke 6:38)

There are other ways of being generous as well. I was very happy to that this past weekend at the church and at the chapel 25 people expressed an interest in the St. Vincent de Paul Society. I know that not all of them will be able to make this a more permanent commitment, but the fact that so many are interested is a great tribute to the fruitfulness of the work of the Holy Spirit in our parish. It will be up to all of us as a parish community to support the work of the Society, even if we can't join their ranks.

As a parish community, we have much to be grateful for and I thank God for all the good people who continue to be faithful to the service of God and neighbor, especially for the parish staff and for all those who volunteer so generously of their time. I hope that all who are able will join us at 9 o'clock on Thursday morning for the Mass of Thanksgiving. As always, bread for the table will be blessed and distributed at the end of the Mass.
