This week we shall celebrate that quintessentially American holiday of Thanksgiving. They had fled their homes to escape the state church of England and had found even the Calvinism of the Netherlands too worldly for their comfort. On our rocky shores they hoped to establish a "New England" where they could be free to practice a form of Christianity that they believed conformed more closely to the demands of the bible.


