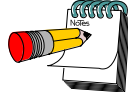

From the Pastor

Because of the Thanksgiving holiday, this issue of the bulletin has to go to the printers on Friday, November 18. So, by the time you read this Thanksgiving will have passed and we'll be starting a new liturgical year with the first Sunday of Advent.

We have much to be thankful for here in St. Francis parish. I am especially grateful to two groups of people: the staff, who work so diligently for not a lot of money, and the volunteers, without whose generous contribution of time we could not continue the services we offer to the parishioners and to the public. God bless them all and give them the reward of their labors!

It's certainly true that generous people make the world a better place. You may have noticed that after last year's increased-giving efforts, the first collection on the weekends rose significantly. Now, as so often happens, it's beginning to decline again. Last year we came in below budget due to two factors: your generosity and our reduction of expenses. If we hope to continue this good outcome, we need everyone *at least to maintain* the level of giving they promised in the fall of 2015. My first desire is not that people give more, but that more people give. Still, it falls to those of us who care, to take up the slack. For example, what we charge parents for religious education covers about 20% of the expenses of that program alone and provides nothing for anything else it takes to run a parish. I have pointed out before that we have 1900 registered households and yet only around 300 household give us anything that we can measure through the use of budget envelopes or online giving. Parishes that wish to survive and thrive must have the support of the people who belong to that community of faith.

The new liturgical year is a good time to renew ourselves as believing and practicing Catholics. As the great Epistle to the Hebrews 10:39 puts it: "We are not among those who draw back and are lost, but among those who keep faith and live!"

A very happy Advent to all!

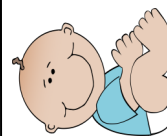

The WARM Center in Westerly, RI, and the Welcome House of South County, in Peace Dale are agencies available that provide a variety of services to men, women, and families in South County, RI, and in Southeastern CT. Some of the services include providing emergency shelter, food, clothing, employment preparation, transitional and supportive housing programs, as well as a number of other services.

They reach out to landlords & property managers in the community who may have affordable housing and work to identify appropriate candidates to refer to them with the goal of supporting successful long-term tenancy. They currently assist several families in the Washington County area in their search for affordable year round housing and have been finding it to be an extremely challenging task.
