

Into Your Hands, Lord

I was called to the hospital in the middle of the night and directed to the room of a woman who was dying, surrounded by family. Her breathing was labored and it seemed the end was near. She was not visibly conscious. I anointed her, and afterward I prayed with her family.

I then thought of praying the Apostolic Pardon, which asks that the dying person be released from sin and all temporal punishments. (I was a new priest and it was one of my first anointings.) As soon as I uttered the "Amen" that completed the prayer, the woman sighed her last breath and died. I was astounded.

I remained a while with the family in silence. As I was leaving, her daughter stopped me and said, "Father, did you see that?" To verify for myself what I experienced, I asked, "See what?" The daughter, too, spoke of her amazement that her mother gave up her spirit precisely at the "Amen," as if she had been waiting for that pardon.

I did not know this family, or their dying mother. They were from another parish. I didn't ask if she was a practicing Catholic and I did not know the state of her soul. But through the prayers of the Church and my priesthood, God showered her with overabundant grace.

In this month of All Souls Day, may we pray that all of our beloved deceased receive the grace-filled welcome of that stranger in the hospital, who was revealed to be a beloved daughter of God.


