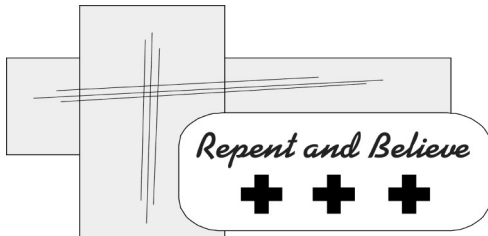

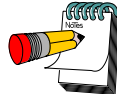

## From the Pastor,

1. Last week I mentioned how parishes are not in a position to provide many home services to those in need. On Sunday afternoon I got an email from one of our faithful parishioners, a member of the St. Romuald's worship community. Here's a piece of what she wrote: In today's bulletin you addressed the problems with providing various services for those in need. There is an organization here in South County that does just that. It is called Southern RI Volunteers and is located at the Charlestown Community Center in Ninigret Park (401 552-7661). They work with the Johnny Cake Center and Habitat for Humanity, but they also facilitate medical transports, grocery shopping, "friendly visitors", etc. for individuals. A person signs up with the agency and makes his or her requests; the agency then coordinates the request with an available volunteer. They provide insurance to the volunteer.
2. As you can read elsewhere in this bulletin, we have welcomed Emily Cuellar, a young lady from Salve Regina University, a member of St. Patrick's parish in Providence, as a youth minister. Emily is going to try to develop a program for the young people of St. Francis and St. Thomas More parishes, focusing on leadership and growth in Christian life. Because she's a fulltime college student, she'll be in our area only perhaps 10 hours a month, but please pray that her time with us is enjoyable and successful in forming our young people in following Christ.
3. The first weekend of our adult coffee hour for religious education parents went very well. Any number of people stopped by after dropping their children off for CCD, either during the 9-10 o'clock or the 11-12 o'clock time slot. Thanks to the O'Briens, the Sabos and the McQuarries for organizing this. God bless the work! October is the Month of the Holy Rosary and the rosary will be recited every weeknight at 6:30 in St. Romuald's chapel. This Monday evening only, we'll include Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament the rosary will be offered for those affected by the recent hurricanes and earthquakes.

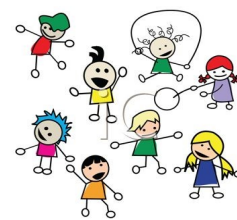
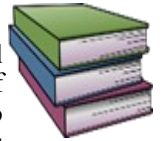
