# From the Pastor

October is the month of the holy rosary and the rosary is prayed publicly in our parish every weeknight at 6:30 in St. Romuald's chapel. A plenary indulgence is offered to the faithful who pray the rosary aloud in a group. A plenary indulgence is the remission of all the penance we owe the Church in reparation for the spiritual harm caused by our sins. To gain such an indulgence one must go to confession, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the pope, and be free from all attachment to sin. Even apart from this, all those who recite the rosary together receive a partial indulgence.

There are other rosaries besides the Dominican rosary we're familiar with. For example, the Franciscan rosary consists in seven decades meditating on the seven joys or seven sorrows of our Lady. But the 15 decades of the Dominican rosary—*The Rosary* as most of us know it—are based on the 150 psalms of the bible which form the basis of the official liturgical prayer of the Church.

The Dominican order, the Order of Preachers, was founded in the early 13<sup>th</sup> century to combat Albigensianism, a form of Dualism, which denied the goodness of the visible, material creation. Much of the south of France and parts of the north of Italy had left the Catholic Church to follow this heretical sect and much effort was made by the Church, not excluding military compulsion, to bring them back to the Faith. The new orders of friars, especially the Dominicans and Franciscans, gave a good deal of their energy in fighting this denial of the goodness of creation.

The 15 mysteries of the Dominican rosary were chosen to emphasize the reality of the Incarnation: that the Son of God became truly human and that in this human flesh he truly suffered, died and rose again, and that this human body was raised above the heavens to be seated at the right hand of the Father. The last two mysteries—the Assumption of our Lady and her glorification in heaven—are also celebrations of the dignity of created human nature.

In our society, which is so riven with Dualism, the Rosary is a great lesson in authentic Christianity.


This special liturgy formally marks the beginning of their preparation to receive Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time in the spring. All are welcome!
