## From the Pastor,

Several things: First, congratulations to our faithful parishioner Joe Clossick, who is in training to be ordained as a deacon. He and his class will be installed as acolytes of the Church this Sunday (today) at a Mass at 2 p.m. in St. Mary's church in Cranston.

Elsewhere: Someone reminded me last weekend that just 10 years ago this parish raised over 2 million dollars to redo Fr. Greenan Hall. So he thought we shouldn't have any trouble meeting our \$626,000 goal for the Grateful for God's Providence campaign. From his lips to God's ear!

Also: Please explain to your children that when they marry and move out of this territory to establish a separate household, they are no longer members of this parish. They are welcome to become members *IF* they are willing to come here regularly for Mass and practice the Catholic Faith. I will not register people who live outside the parish boundaries unless they actually come here on a regular basis. They are certainly welcome to have their children baptized here but I will expect them to get me a letter of permission from the pastor of the parish in which they are living. "I made all my sacraments there!" doesn't cut the mustard, especially if their confirmation or their wedding was the last time they were here for Mass.

One last thing: If you contribute financially to the support of the parish, I would encourage you to use parish budget envelopes, to use your personal check, or to give online. Otherwise 1) we cannot confirm your giving for tax purposes and 2) it makes it look as though fewer parishioners support us than actually do. Still, I am grateful for whatever our parishioners are willing and able to give to support the works of the parish.


