# From the Pastor

As I write, the roofers are finishing their work at St. Romuald's chapel. I can't thank our loyal parishioner Larry LeBlanc enough for all he's done on this project and for all his generous support of the chapel over the years. It has been his generous interest in this project that resulted in its success. The support of the loyal chapel community, including the summer residents, was really heartwarming and bodes well for the future of St. Romuald's.

At the parish church the boiler project has been a bit rockier than we expected. Luckily, another loyal parishioner, Ed Rudegeair, has been spearheading this effort, and thanks to his expertise I never had to attend to the details of boiler replacement, something about which I know next to nothing. The burner has been replaced so that we can continue to keep the heat on, and when all the parts to the new system arrive, the whole thing can be done without any significant interruption of service.

While I'm thanking the two above-mentioned people for their contribution over and above the call of duty, I'd like to take this opportunity to express my thanks to several other people who are paid staff members, not volunteers, but whose efforts help to keep us on track. Our new secretary and our new bookkeeper, Jacki Hunt and Mary Clarke, have jumped into the fray with great courage. It's not easy to pick up from Kelli McNulty, who was here for 25 years, but both of them are working flat out to keep the parochial wheels turning smoothly.

And always, behind the scenes, is our faithful custodian of 30 years, Bobby Kelly. No matter what event is taking place here, Bobby is always in the background, making sure the spaces are ready of the next event, assembling and dissembling and reassembling things so that we can move easily from a special event to religious education classes. It is he who comes in the night to make sure the snow is shoveled before Mass the next day, who cuts the grass and trims the bushes, who makes sure the church is closed on Sundays after baptisms, and who takes care of so many things which the public would never notice.
