# From the Pastor,

As I have written in the past, it takes nearly \$700,000 a year to run this parish, even with the incredible amount of work done by volunteers.

From time to time, there are also unexpected expenses that arise in maintaining all the buildings and facilities that are part of parish life. So far in this fiscal year, which began on July 1, we have incurred the following expenses:

For the Helen Bouchard Hall for new heating and air-conditioning units: \$25,100. The new system is a more cost-effective way of avoiding mold and mildew and regulating the temperature without replacing the whole outside compressor that had given up the ghost many months ago. In addition to the HVAC work, the electric bill to connect the system to the grid was \$3,380. So the whole project, which took months, cost us \$28,480. Alas, we know that the upstairs system for the church itself cannot be far behind.

There was also trouble with the HVAC in **Fr. Greenan Center**, the cost of parts and labor **was \$4,700**.

The outside walls and roof of the **parish office building** were getting overwhelmed with mold and algae. The power wash that was necessary to maintain the building was **\$1,384** 

So the total expenses that are not the normal monthly bills are **\$34,564.00**. This will not show up in the financial report for the past fiscal year which we are now in the process of preparing for you; you'll see it in the report that will be issued next fall.

We'd have absolutely no problem in dealing with all these expenses if all who claim to be parishioner chipped in their fair amount. Some other time I'll give you some facts and figures about financial giving here at our parish. Something to look forward to in the next few weeks.


