From the Pastor

I write this on the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi, our patron, which we celebrate as a Feast in our parish. He was born in Assisi in the region of Umbria in central Italy around the year 1182 and baptized John. Francesco (Frenchy) was a nickname he received perhaps because of his love of the ballads of the troubadours of Provence in the south of France. More likely, his father called him Francesco in his childhood because of the father's success in business with the merchants of Provence. It may be as well that his mother was of Provencal background.

At his father's insistence, he went off around the age of 20 to fight in a local war against the city of Perugia. The experience was of, defeat and imprisonment, and a later illness left him with what is nowadays called Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, and caused him to reevaluate his goals and values and around the age of 22, he renounced his inheritance and his plans for a career and took to the streets, begging for his food and embracing radical poverty and the ownership of any material possessions or property, personal or communal.

The details of his life as a friar minor or "lesser brother" have been much written about over the centuries, including his reception of the Stigmata (wounds) of Christ and his death at the age of 44. Here I'd like to include just a few saying attributed to him.

- Above all the grace and the gifts that Christ gives to his beloved is that of overcoming self.
- No one is to be called an enemy; all are your benefactors, and no one does you harm. You have no enemy except yourselves.
- Start by doing what's necessary; then do what's possible; and suddenly you are doing the impossible.
- We know only as much as we put into practice.
- Temptation overcome is the ring with which the Lord espouses the soul of his beloved.
- Most Holy Lord, I should like to love you. Dearest God, I should like to love you.
