

SERVICE OF PRAYER AND REPENTANCE

Bishop Thomas Tobin invites all the members of the clergy, all the members of the Church, and all those who have expressed their deep concern over the recent allegations of sexual abuse of minors by priests, and negligence of bishops in dealing with the crisis to join him in a special day of prayer and penance on Friday, September 14<sup>th</sup>. The event will begin with Noon Mass at the Cathedral of SS. Peter & Paul, followed by three hours of Eucharistic Adoration, and concluding with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 3:00pm.

September 14, the "Exaltation of the Holy Cross of Christ." is an important Feast Day for Catholics. The Bishop has chosen this date as a reminder that from the immense suffering of the Cross came redemption and new life for the world. Through the power of Christ's Cross, and the intercession of our Blessed Mother, our Lady of Sorrows, may God bring healing and peace to all those who have suffered the horrible and long-lasting pain of sexual abuse, as well as true repentance, reform and reconciliation to the Church and community.

Bishop Tobin states his commitment to provide a safe environment for children and youth in the Diocese of Providence, to purge the Church of these horrible acts and to respond compassionately to all those who have been harmed. May God forgive us our sins and grant us the grace to follow a path of reform and renewal.

#### 2018 MISSION COOPERATIVE APPEAL

The Propagation of the Faith Office of our Diocese has invited the diocese of Kumbakonam, India to speak to us about their missionary activities and challenges. Accordingly, Rev. Benjamin Franklin will be speaking to us during all Masses next weekend, September 8/9.

This Diocese started in 1899 in the State of Tamil Nadu, India which has a Catholic population of 213,000 (6% of the population). It is served by 210 diocesan and 63 religious priests, 588 nuns and 15 trained lay catechists.

Following are some of the goals for a New Evangelization:

- ♦ Establishing 10 more new parishes, each with a new church & rectory. Currently there are 93 parishes & 618 mission-stations. Most of the Catholics have no means of transportation & are unable to give financial support.
- ♦ To provide the 126 Catholic schools in the missions with better facilities, tools, children's Bibles, text-books & workbooks, etc.
- ♦ Enabling 485 nuns and 2155 Catholic teachers in charge of catechetical, educational, medical & social ministries throughout this rural diocese, to educate the children in the Catholic faith & to help the people, particularly the poor, for their integral development.
- Education of more young men in the seminary, since the diocese abounds in vocation to the priesthood & religious life so that some can be sent as missionaries abroad where there is a shortage of priest.
- ♦ Education of 1000 very poor or orphan children from poor families every year by providing them with free board & lodge. All of the above projects are 80% dependent on Mission Cooperative Funds.
