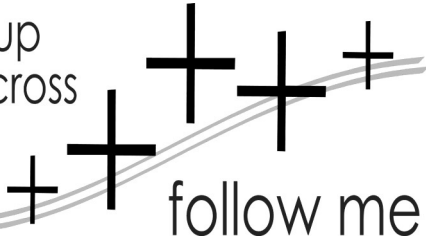

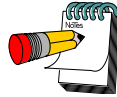

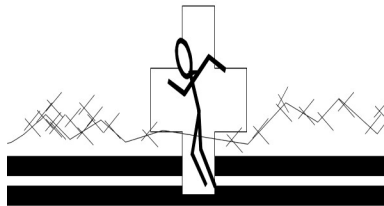

Those who lose their life for my sake



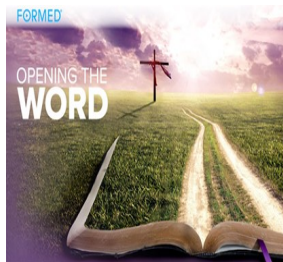

## From Fr. Ricci,

In the Book of Ecclesiastes we read, "There is an appointed time for everything" (Eccl 3:1). Sadly, the time has arrived for me to depart Saint Francis Parish as I return to Rome to finish my license in Canon Law. As you know, in the midst of a person's life, goodbyes are necessary, but never easy. While I am eager to finish my studies, I must admit such a departure leaves me with a mixture of emotions. Nostalgia reminds me of the moments of joy, laughter, and the abounding presence of God's grace, which were hallmarks of these summer months. While this indeed enkindles certain sadness in leaving such a wonderful community of faith, these memories also prompt me to a profound sense of gratitude for the opportunity to serve you, learn from you, and grow with you during this journey upon which the Lord has placed us.

Pope Saint John Paul II once remarked, "In the designs of Divine Providence, there are no coincidences." The Lord has His reasons, known only to Him, for assigning me here to Saint Francis for my first assignment in parochial work, and to Him and His Church, I am immensely grateful for a blessed and rewarding summer of ministry in His vineyard. Thank you for your inspiring witness to the faith, your joy, and your love for God's Church. In particular, I am deeply grateful to Fr. Henry Bodah for his example of priestly charity, and for the kindness he has shown me as a brother priest. To the parish staff and all our parish volunteers at St. Francis and St. Romuald, I am grateful to you for your leadership and constant encouragement, which remains the bedrock of this community. To our youth especially, whose joy for the Gospel is an indelible sign of the presence of God, I thank you. Continue to open your hearts to the call of Christ for your lives. I assure you, He will give you the greatest joy known to man—the deepest joy, in fact, that there is in the world. When we follow Christ and His Church unreservedly, we encounter not sadness, nor banality, nor constraint, but deep and lasting fulfillment, wonder and excitement, and authentic human freedom.

I would ask you all to continue to pray for me and for our priests. Please also remember in your prayers those men and women discerning a call to the priesthood or religious life. Let us pray that many more young men and women from our diocese and parish might answer the call of Christ in their hearts to give of themselves entirely for Him and His Church, to accept the life of mysterious wonder he has prepared for them for all eternity. As Our Lord tells us Himself, "I have come so that they may have life, and have it abundantly!" (Jn 10:10).

To all our parishioners, thank you for everything you have done for me and for this parish, and may God bless you and your families abundantly. Lastly, let us pray for each other always – *Oremus pro invicem!*

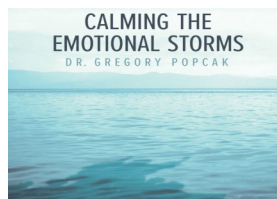
