THE SAINTS OF CHRISTMAS

In the week immediately following Christmas, the Church commemorates some of the most fascinating saints in our tradition. On December 26, we celebrate **Saint Stephen**, the first disciple of Christ to die for his Christian faith. On December 27, we celebrate **Saint John the Evangelist**, who is known as the "beloved disciple" of Jesus and who taught the young Church so much through his gospel. On December 28, we celebrate the **Holy Innocents**, those little children who died in place of the infant Jesus because of the wrath of Herod. And on December 29, we celebrate **Saint Thomas Becket**, twelfth-century bishop of Canterbury who died because he defended the freedoms and rights of the Church.
