
CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS CHOIR

My Soul in Stillness Waits: Advent 2011

Throughout this holy season of Advent, our parish will be reflecting on the theme: "My Soul in Stillness Waits." You have seen it on our parish bulletin cover; you will hear it during our weekly Prayer of the Faithful; you will sing it during the Communion procession; this theme will influence our preaching, teaching and praying as a parish family. Advent is the season of waiting, of watching in joyful anticipation for the coming of Christ, not only at Christmastime, but at the end of time, when he will definitively establish his kingdom. But waiting for Christ requires stillness of heart and mind because he also comes to us daily, often unannounced and unseen. The challenge of Advent is to wait in stillness for the Christ who chose to come in humility and meekness rather than pomp and splendor. "For you, O Lord, my soul in stillness waits. Truly my hope is in you."
