WITHOUT SUNDAY WE CANNOT LIVE!

Without Sunday we cannot live! Wow, is that a powerful statement! It was proclaimed hundreds of years ago. Yes, in the ancient city of Abitene, a Roman province, there were followers of Jesus, early Christians. In the year 303 a persecution broke out. The Roman Emperor ordered that sacred texts and holy scriptures of the Lord were to be burned, basilicas torn down, and the celebration of holy rites were to be prohibited. Disobeying the emperor's orders, a group of 49 Christians gathered weekly to offer Mass on Sunday morning. Taken by surprise at one of their Sunday celebrations, they were arrested and taken to Carthage to be interrogated.

When the judge asked them why they had disobeyed the command of the emperor, one brave disciple of Jesus answered for the group: "Without Sunday we cannot live!" In other words, those Christians believed what we believe today: On Sunday we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus! Each Sunday, we call to mind this very Resurrection Day! Easter isn't celebrated only once a year! But better than that, Sunday is the Lord's Day, the day to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the Eucharist. Without the Eucharist, we cannot hope to live a Christian life, and, in fact, we cannot live any life! Life is Christ! Christ comes to us in the Eucharist! The Eucharist is our Food of Life!

The spokesman continued in his bold explanation of faith to the judge: "Don't you know that it is the Sunday Eucharist which makes the Christian and the Christian makes the Sunday Eucharist, so that one cannot subsist without the other, and vice versa?"



Easter Sunday and the eight days following it (the "Octave" of Easter) are 🔺 celebrated as one. continuous Easter day! Each day of Easter week is treated liturgically as though it were Easter Sunday itself! This practice of the ancient Church points to the centrality of the celebration


of Easter as the high-point of the liturgical year. And beyond that, the Easter Season itself stretches over seven whole weeks! The Church calls us to repent for five weeks of Lent but to rejoice in Christ's resurrection for seven! The soulful "alleluia" which we have fasted from is now revived. Even the church building which has remained bare during our sojourn in the desert of Lent is now bursting with color and life! In her celebration of Compline (Night Prayer), the Church requires the singing of the "Regina Caeli," to our Blessed Mother, a prayer which could become your own during this Easter Season: "Queen of heaven rejoice, alleluia! For he whom you did merit to bear, alleluia! Has risen as he promised, alleluia! Pray for us to God, alleluia! Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, alleluia! For the Lord has truly risen, alleluia! Let us pray. O God, who gave joy to the world through the resurrection of Thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, grant we beseech Thee, that through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, His Mother, we may obtain the joys of everlasting life. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen."

A SPECIAL DAY OF PRAYER IN HONOR OF POPE JOHN PAUL II

On May 1, Pope Benedict will "beatify" Pope John Paul II. This means that the Church, in light of a confirmed miracle due to his intercession, will officially recognize his heroic sanctity and his worthiness for veneration and imitation. From May 1 on, Pope John Paul will be known as "Blessed John Paul II" and his feast day will be observed on October 22 each year. The entire world witnessed his long suffering, and his willingness to walk the way of Jesus crucified. When he died, the world indeed lost a father. On Saturday, April 30, our parish will host a special day of prayer to mark this A special Mass will be momentous occasion. 10:00AM celebrated at in Saint Romuald's Chapel. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will follow throughout the entire day. The day will be punctuated with special reflections and prayers at 1PM, 3PM, and 5PM. A reflection and simple reposition will conclude the day of prayer at 7PM. Please consider joining us!

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

In the 1930's a special devotion began to spread through the Church. A young polish nun, now Saint, Faustina Kowalska, was visited by Jesus who instructed her to spread the message of his "Divine Mercy."



The message is simple: God loves us no matter how great our sins are. This doesn't mean that he overlooks our sin, but he wants us to realize that his mercy is infinitely greater than us! Jesus instructed that an image be commissioned with Himself at the center, and two rays emanating from his Sacred Heart, one white ray (symbolizing the cleansing power of baptism) and one red ray (symbolizing the blood Jesus shed on the cross to save us from our sins). At the bottom of this image, Jesus instructed that the words, "Jesus, I Trust in You" be prominently displayed. Trust in Jesus' mercy and love is at the heart of this beautiful devotion.

Furthermore, Jesus instructed that the Second Sunday of Easter be celebrated as "Divine Mercy Sunday." In our own century, Pope John Paul II extended the celebration of this special feast to the Universal Church. Observing Divine Mercy Sunday means going to Mass and Confession on that day, and praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, a simple yet powerful prayer, prayed with ordinary rosary beads.

We will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, which falls this year on **May 1**, at St. Romuald Chapel.

The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at 1:00PM, followed by Confessions. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed at 3:00PM (materials will be provided). The afternoon will conclude with a special Celebration of Mass at 3:30PM.
