LENT 2013 THEME: LET ME FIND MY LIFE IN YOU

Throughout the season of Lent, we will pray and reflect together on our parish theme, "Let me find my life in you." The song, "O Beauty Ever Ancient, Ever New," from which we drew our Lenten theme, will be sung throughout the season and is based on a famous passage from the Confessions of Saint Augustine. One of the best known converts in Christendom, Saint Augustine reflected honestly on his search for happiness in all the wrong places until his famous realization: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee, O God!" He had sought fulfillment in created things, but failed to find his true life in the Creator. Perhaps Lent 2013 will prove to be a turning point toward a deeper relationship with Christ and his Church. Apart from them, there is no life! May the words of Saint Paul guide us on our Lenten journey: "Your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory."

THE SIGHTS AND SOUNDS OF LENT

Our worship spaces will soon reflect the starkness of the Lenten season. Flowers and greens will have no place by the altar and even unbleached candles—used in centuries gone by throughout the penitential seasons—will make an appearance in the sanctuaries of our church and chapel. At St. Francis Church, a special crucifix will accompany us throughout Lent and will be venerated by our parish community on Good Friday. Even our singing will reflect the solemn tone of the season. These signs, sounds and symbols are meant to foster a deeper sense of prayer and conversion as we find our life more deeply in Christ.

LENTEN CALENDAR

In today's bulletin, you will find our 2013 Lenten Calendar. Please keep the calendar on hand throughout the season; perhaps you could even make room on your refrigerator! Our parish staff has planned a number of enriching opportunities for prayer and education throughout the season and we hope you will take advantage of all that will be going on!

THE THREE PILLARS OF LENT

The Lenten Season is characterized by an emphasis on three elements of the Christian life: PRAYER, FASTING and ALMSGIVING.

- PRAYER—During Lent, consider spending some extra time each day reading from Sacred Scripture (the daily Mass readings are a good place to start and can be accessed at www.usccb.org) or simply making yourself available to listen to God. Resolve to attend Mass on at least one weekday. Try to recite our parish Lenten prayer everyday throughout Lent.
- <u>FASTING</u>—This pillar concerns not only the fast days of the season (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday) but also voluntarily refraining from something to foster self-control. For example, perhaps you could fast from television or from the internet for a set period of time each day. Talk to your friends about what you plan on "giving up" for Lent; perhaps they have (or need) ideas as well!
- <u>ALMSGIVING</u>—Lent is a time to share our treasure with others. Operation Rice Bowl is an annual fundraiser which benefits Catholic Relief Services. Place it in a prominent place in your home and let the whole family contribute to it. Another possibility is to contribute some additional food to the basket at the church entrance.

Our 2013 Lenten Mission is based on the *sacramental life of the Church* and will be presented by Fr. John Reutemann of the Archdiocese of Washington, DC. Please consider joining us as we enter into the Lenten season, a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.
