From the Pastor...

As I am writing this column, we are expecting another "Alberta Clipper" snow storm to come through tomorrow! Hopefully it will fizzle out. This past weekend's storm caused us to cancel our Appreciation Night. We really do appreciate all our volunteers, but we are going to wait for better weather before we re-schedule an event.

Obviously, weekend storms are the worst for us. Last Saturday's storm was raging during the 4:30 PM Mass and continued well into the night. I am very grateful to Bob Kelly, our maintenance man, who worked with our plowing and snow removal team to do their best to make the church accessible. They tried to stay ahead of the snow on Saturday afternoon, but it was coming down very hard by 4:00 PM. They returned during the night to spend hours (from about 1:00 to 5:00 AM) clearing the lot, walks and steps around the church and rectory so that it would be clear for morning Masses and I believe they did a great job.

That being said, I was very annoyed to hear that someone who came to the 4:30 Mass complained vociferously to Father Joe that the front steps weren't properly shoveled. All I can say is that we do our best and at considerable expense to the parish. This winter, not counting last weekend's storm, we have spent \$7,500 for snow removal just for the church property (the chapel and cemetery are additional). We are genuinely concerned about the safety of everyone who comes here. However, it can't always be perfect. So, especially if it is still snowing and you are concerned about walks and steps, I suggest you stay home rather than endanger yourself. Better to be safe than sorry.

As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, the diocesan Catholic Charity Appeal is getting underway and will continue through the season of Lent. Next weekend we will speak about the Appeal and we will do the in-pew solicitation. There will be donation envelopes available and you will have the opportunity to make your pledge or one-time gift to the Appeal.

You may have heard the sad news that Margy Keegan, a 3rd grader at Matunuck Elementary School, who is in our religious education program was in a sledding accident recently. It turns out that she had suffered a stroke which affected the right side of her body and her speech. She is presently recovering at a hospital in Boston and her mother has not left her side. Some friends and parishioners are organizing a fundraiser to assist the family in this time of need. There will be a Spaghetti Dinner/Raffle/Silent Auction on Friday, March 7 from 5:30 to 7:00 PM in Father Greenan Hall. Tickets are \$10 for adults and \$7 for children (12 & under) and will be available after Masses next weekend both at the church and the chapel. If you are unable to attend, donations will also be gratefully accepted. Please join me in praying for Margy and her family. May the Lord bless her with a speedy and full recovery.

Our volunteers are tired and often available only weekends or evenings. **We need a relief team of new volunteers** to help this week.


