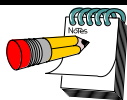

THE MINISTRY OF CANTOR AT SAINT FRANCIS CHURCH

We are truly blessed at St. Francis and St. Romuald by the generosity of men and women from our parish who devote themselves, under the able leadership of Mimi Battey and Karen Graham respectively, to service in music ministry as members of choirs or ensembles, as well as instrumentalists. The ministry of cantor, too, stands out as an important role in the service of the liturgy.

"Cantors come to us from Judaism, where the hazzan sings the traditional intricate Hebraic cantillations and leads the congregation in song...Exactly where and when the office of hazzan (cantor) originated, history does not tell us. However, it is a position of long standing and of great importance."

We are presently in need of cantors at St. Francis Church. In order to maintain a balance of voices in our parish choir, we are looking for *additional* men and women with singing/musical experience to privately audition for the ministry of cantor. Here are some common hesitations:

I can't commit to joining the choir.

Cantors fulfill a separate ministry from the choir. They commit to singing at weekend liturgies on a rotating basis.

I'm afraid of singing alone in front of a group of people.

Technically, you won't be in *front* of a group of people! You'll be singing from the choir loft, which does provide a measure of relief from stage fright!

I am not a "professional" musician.

People with professional training are certainly welcome and encouraged to audition, but all that is really needed is a good, strong voice and a willingness to learn!

What if I don't know "church music" well enough?

Don't worry! The music is provided in advance and a practice CD is prepared from week to week.
