The next Book Club meeting will take place this Wednesday, August 3rd at 10:00am in Helen Bouchard Hall located in the basement of the church.

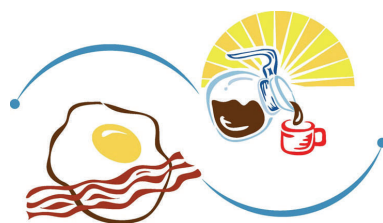
BILL BOUCHARD MEMORIAL MASS

IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

In today's First Reading, Isaiah invites all those who thirst to come to the Lord for water. This is the posture of all those who approach God through the liturgy each week. We come to the Lord thirsting for the living water of grace, and only God can satiate that thirst. Jesus pours out his grace in abundance upon us through the sacraments and our deepest spiritual longings are satisfied. God asks his people through the prophet, "Why do you spend your money on what is not food? Why waste your wages on what fails to fulfill you?" We often seek fulfillment in all the wrong places. We "spend our lives" on a search that often leaves us feeling empty. Christ is here, waiting for us to approach him with open and sincere hearts. We should prepare ourselves before each liturgy, asking God to open our hearts so that we can receive whichever graces he wants to give us through our devout participation in that celebration. Notice that in today's Gospel, Jesus blesses, breaks and distributes the bread to the crowds in a ritual manner. It is meant to invoke Eucharistic overtones. The gesture of Jesus, looking up to heaven toward the Father, has even made its way into the rubrics of the Mass, when the priest during the First Eucharistic Prayer looks up toward heaven before the consecration. The highly Eucharistic act of Jesus recounted in today's Gospel gives a further clue about God's desire to fulfill our longing: our worthy and devout participation in the Eucharist is the pinnacle of spiritual fulfillment in this life. We should approach the altar well prepared and properly disposed so that Christ's life in us can lay down deep roots.

THE "PORTIUNCULA"

This coming week, Franciscans around the world will celebrate the feast of the "Portiuncula" (meaning literally, "little portion") on August 2. The Portiuncula is the little chapel just outside of Assisi where our parish patron, Saint Francis, first received his vocation while praying in front of the Cross of San Damiano. The little chapel, now surrounded by a much larger basilica, is officially dedicated to Our Lady of the Angels. It was there that Francis rolled in the thorn bush to squelch his temptations, it was there that Francis spent most of his earthly life, and it was there that he finally died in 1226. May our own parish church always be a "little portion" set aside for prayer and devotion, like the little chapel of our patron, Saint Francis!

TAKE A BOW...

As Catholics, we believe that prayer engages the whole person, even one's body! Our postures and bodily gestures during the Mass (standing, kneeling, bowing) are meant to foster an interior disposition of prayer and reverence. During the Mass, in addition to the more common gestures, the ENTIRE congregation should BOW at the following words during the recitation of the Creed: *"By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh and was born of the Virgin Mary."* Additionally, before receiving Holy Communion, the person approaching the priest, deacon or extraordinary minister of the Eucharist, should BOW, *then* extend their hands or their tongue to receive the Sacred Host. Another BOW is made before drinking the Precious Blood from the chalice. Remember, the law of prayer is the law of belief, meaning that the way we pray indicates something of what we believe and hold dear! Think of that the next time you take a bow!

I CAN'T TALK RIGHT NOW!

Please be certain to turn off your cell phone before you enter Church. Those who need to leave their cell phones on for emergency purposes should silence them before Mass. An announcement is normally made at the beginning of each Mass, but some miss the announcement. Please be conscious of maintaining a prayerful and reverent atmosphere in our Church and Chapel.
