

From the Pastor

Pope Francis has been in the news a lot lately. Recently he released his much-anticipated encyclical on care for creation. As his first encyclical, *The Light of Faith*, was basically the work of his predecessor, this new document, *Laudato si'*, is considered the first to come entirely from his own pen. There is not space here to outline the whole work, but perhaps several comments would be permitted. First of all, I'm happy to see that the first words, which form the title of the encyclical, are neither Latin nor modern Italian but the original 13th century Umbrian dialect as spoken by St. Francis in his "Canticle of the Creatures." Second, the subtitle of the work is significant: "On Care for our Common Home." Third, the tone, typical of Pope Francis, is undogmatic, calling for discussion and dialogue. Fourth, there are challenges hidden in the work that may not be evident at first glance.

Here is a quotation from an online article about the new encyclical: Francis reportedly has said that the encyclical was not really an environmental document at all. The warming of the planet is a symptom of a greater problem: that the developed world's indifference to the destruction of the planet as they pursue short-term economic gains. This has resulted in a "throw away" culture in which unwanted items and unwanted people, such as the unborn, the elderly, and the poor, are discarded as waste. This subtext makes the document "more profoundly subversive" than it appears on the surface. The real problem, according to Francis, lies in the fact that humans no longer see God as the Creator. Thus, we see "other living beings as mere objects subjected to arbitrary human domination" and do not realize that the ultimate purpose of other creatures is not found in us.

The pope is also in the midst of a trip—his eighth outside Italy--to three of the smaller, less news-grabbing countries of South America: Ecuador, Bolivia and Paraguay. His theme in the first of those sites has been the family. "Christ can take even what might seem to us impure, scandalous or threatening, and turn it ... into a miracle. Families today need miracles!" Hmm. I wonder what this portends.

He also used the image of the water turned into wine at the wedding feast of Cana in John's gospel: "Wine is a sign of happiness, love and plenty. How many of our adolescents and young people sense that these are no longer found in their homes? How many women, sad and lonely, wonder when love left, when it slipped away from their lives? How many elderly people feel left out of family celebrations, cast aside and longing each day for a little love?"
