

AN EYE ON THE SAINTS

This week some pretty big hitters come up on the Church's calendar of feast days: Saint James (July 25th), Saints Joachim and Anne (parents of the Blessed Mother on July 26th) and Saint Martha who we'll focus on today.

July 29th is Saint Martha's feast day. She, as you recall is, the sister in the gospels who busied herself preparing a meal while her sister Mary 'chose the better part' and sat at the feet of Jesus. How many of us have felt like Saint Martha at some time or other? Poor, Martha! She got a bad rap as a complainer but Martha is also the sister who professed her great faith in Jesus before the raising of her brother Lazarus from the dead. Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world' (John 11:25-27).

With Martha, may we refrain from busying ourselves with matters that pull us away from Jesus. Let us choose the better part and take time to sit with Jesus so that He can love us into being and becoming the creations He calls us to be. **St. Martha**, *pray for us!*

From the Pastor

We know by faith that the death of Christ on the cross was the atonement for all sin. The perfect obedience of Jesus "unto death" was accepted by the Father as undoing the disobedience of the rest of us.

That death happened once and cannot and need not be repeated, nevertheless can be made present to us again and again whenever the Eucharist is celebrated. Moreover, according to a custom going back to the early centuries, the Mass can be offered for the eternal salvation of individuals. This is the origin of the funeral Mass and of the custom of having Masses offered for the dead. It is also as way of remembering with affection those who have gone before us and celebrating their memories in the context of common worship.

Several times since returning to parish ministry I have been called to bring the last rites of the Church do a dying parishioner and then have waited in vain for the funeral to be booked. It is a sad fact that nowadays some Catholics who loved their faith and attended Mass faithfully, die and receive no funeral, nor is their memory recalled at the altar of the Lord.

So we have begun a Perpetual Mass Association here at St. Francis parish. People can leave a legacy in their wills to participate in this association and the Mass will be offered every month for the repose of their souls.

The diocese has set a minimum of \$10,000 before a foundation such as this can be established. We have already received half of that sum. If you are interested in being part of this association, please call the rectory for more information.
