A WELCOMING WORD TO THE NEW PASTOR

Dear Monsignor Paul:

With open arms and radiant smiles the Parish Family of St. Francis of Assisi and St. Romuald will soon welcome you as its 15th pastor. In the less complicated days of seminary and youth long ago, you and I were both taught that essential to life's journey as priest is what is called *kenosis* – letting go! To let go is to die a little, but from the very dying comes new energy, sparkle and freshness. Only in letting go can we grow in the Christ we answered affirmatively when called to "come, follow me."

These past few months have been trying and difficult, an 'in-between' time that's never easy. Both of us have had to adjust to this concept of letting go, - you from a prominent diocesan position and role; me from the parish I called home for fourteen glorious years. An added blessing on your arrival in South County (just so you'll know, north of 'the tower' is another country altogether!) is the presence of Father Joe Upton, an eloquent and fine representation of the new breed of young men gracing the priesthood in the new millennium. He possesses a listening ear and cooperative spirit; is full of energy and hope; and is an incredible enabler in his ability to call forth the gifts and talents of people. In our all-too-quick year together, our relationship blossomed in friendship and respect. May yours do likewise in your time together.

I'll be turning over some keys to you next week! While not exactly the keys of the kingdom, in a special way they're symbolic of the challenge that was mine and is now yours, - to open the hearts of God's People with His Good News and Love. I cannot think of a better man than you to do that here at this time! God-be-with-you in your years in this mighty parish!

IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH: THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today the Church Universal celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. You often hear preachers or catechists say that the concept of the Trinity is simply too complicated to preach or

teach about. But this isn't really true. While the intricacies of the Church's teaching on the Trinity require some serious study to comprehend, the basic quite simple: God is a family truth persons. Imagine that! God is not a solitary being, he is an eternal exchange of love. To be made in the image of God means that we crave communion with him and with others because God himself is an endless communion of persons. The Father loves the Son in such a way that he shares his divine nature with him; the Son receives the generosity of the Father and responds in love. The love which binds them together can be understood as so palpable that it is not just a force or an emotion but another divine person, the Holy Spirit. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the Trinitarian prayer par excellence. It is a prayer offered to the Father, in the Son, through the Holy Spirit. Notice that the climax of the Mass, the Eucharistic Prayer, is addressed to the Father! And the amazing thing about the Mass is that we are entering into Jesus' prayer to He allows his prayer, his sacrifice, to the Father! become our own! Think of the Mass as our being drawn into the inner life of the Trinity!

HELP US COMPLETE THE "UPPER ROOM"!

In the gospels, the upper room was the place where the disciples gathered together for fellowship, meals, and prayer. It was a special place where the disciples could experience union with God and with each other. Saint Francis has its own "upper room" on the third floor of Father Greenan hall. Currently, this space is largely unused and is almost entirely unfurnished. For a year now, our parish staff has been exploring the use of this space in light of our growing youth ministry program. We would like to see that space turned into a contemporary "upper room" for our parish youth, a place to meet and gather, to hang-out and relax, and most importantly, to celebrate their Catholic faith with other young people who face the same struggles. Be on the lookout within the next few weeks for a "wish list" with items we would like to see donated. A set of furniture has already been donated, and we're eager to complete the space for the fall.
