Farewell to Monsignor Theroux

In May of 2009, I was ordained a deacon and assigned to St. Margaret's Church in Rumford. Msgr. Paul Theroux was then the diocesan Vicar General, working at the chancery in Providence but living at St. Margaret's in Rumford. We spent a summer together, along with the pastor, Msgr. Bill McCaffrey, ministering to that parish community.

I came to respect Msgr. Theroux as a wise, caring, prudent and generous priest. I already knew of his reputation for outstanding leadership at the diocesan level, but that summer I was able to see him function as a shepherd of souls. He taught me a great deal. Aside from that, he proved to be wonderful company in the rectory. He was always willing to answer a question, engage in a conversation, or share a meal (very often prepared by him!). By the end of that summer, I was delighted to find that I had gained not only a great colleague in ministry but also a great friend.

You can imagine, then, after spending a wonderful first year as a priest with Fr. Nick Smith, how happy I was that Msgr. Theroux would be coming to St. Francis and St. Romuald. From the moment of his arrival, Monsignor continued to be an outstanding teacher to me in priestly ministry and a dear friend. It is hard to believe that three years have come and gone so quickly. And it is even harder to believe that he is now leaving us for another assignment.

Msgr. Theroux has done such a great deal of good work in such a short time. His expertise at administration has been a great gift to our parish, and the number of improvements he has made to the physical plant alone would be enough to make his tenure here a source of pride. But he has been much more than a prudent steward. He has been a loving shepherd, both to the staff and the people of this parish community. Msgr. Theroux embraced not only the particularities of administration, but also the challenge and the reward of pastoral service to the people of our community, all while continuing to serve on a number of diocesan committees and in other non-parish roles.

One episode of many reveals how loved he was by one demographic in our parish: the nursing home residents. Because of my teaching schedule at Prout, Msgr. Theroux would celebrate the area nursing home Masses in the afternoons throughout a given month. On one occasion, Monsignor had to be elsewhere and I was sent as a fill-in. At the end of the Mass, I said to the residents, "Well, I'm glad I was able to be with you today. Hopefully, I'll be able to come more often." One of the residents replied, "Thanks for the offer, Father, but we're quite happy with the Monsignor!"

We have all been quite happy with the Monsignor and we will be very sad to see him go. I know I will personally miss his advice and guidance, his excellent cooking, and especially his company in the rectory. I know the staff will miss his even-tempered and balanced approach to parish leadership. I know the people of St. Francis and St. Romuald will miss him for his practical and insightful homilies. I know he will be missed by many for myriad reasons. Even Reggie will miss his company! But we wish him well as he moves forward into an unexpected yet promising new assignment at Holy Apostles in Cranston. Our loss is their gain. We will continue to keep Msgr. Theroux in our thoughts and prayers during this time of transition.

We also look forward to the arrival of our new pastor, Fr. Henry Bodah, who I likewise had the pleasure of living and working with at St. Joseph Parish in Providence. Fr. Bodah and Msgr. Theroux are good friends, as well, and I'm sure that Msgr. Theroux will find his way back to St. Francis for an occasional visit.

So Msgr. Theroux, thank you for all that you have done and for all that you have been to us throughout the past three years. May God continue to bless you richly for your priestly service at Holy Apostles and beyond! Ad multos annos!
