
PIZZA WITH PADRE:

LENT 2011: LONGING TO RETURN

"Let us receive these Lenten days with joy, recalling Adam's broken fast, the fruit which parted us from paradise, but left us longing to return at last."

Our first parents were exiled from paradise because they chose their will over God's (see Genesis 3). Isn't that what we really mean by sin? Sin, choosing our will over God's, always leads to isolation and exile: exile from God, from others, and from our true selves. Lent is a

time to *return*. A tree caused our first parents to sin; God willed that the tree of the cross should bring us back to friendship with him! Christ, the new Adam, offers the fruit of forgiveness and reconciliation from the tree on which he was crucified. He awakens in us a longing to return! Our parish theme for Lent 2011 is "**LONGING TO RETURN.**" This rich expression will guide our praying, learning, and even singing during this holy season. May God's grace reawaken in us a longing to return to a deeper, life-giving relationship with Jesus Christ!

IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH: THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today's first reading recounts the story of our first parents' fall from grace. The decision to take for themselves what God wanted them to receive as a gift deeply wounded the relationship between God and the human community. The Jewish people would eventually be drawn into a covenant with God that would help repair that wounded relationship. It's interesting that the Jewish covenant was bound up with certain rituals and liturgical acts, like the offering of sacrifice and prayers for mercy. The high priest would present the prayers of the people to God, and beg his forgiveness on their behalf. The Jewish people understood that the damage caused to our relationship with God through original sin needed to be healed, and that healing was expressed through prayer and liturgy. For we who call Jesus Christ, "Lord," our worship achieves a similar purpose. The forgiveness and salvation we crave has already been purchased for us by the blood of Christ. As Saint Paul reminds us in our second reading, "through one righteous act [the death of Jesus] acquittal and life came to all." Our access to the righteousness of Jesus is bound up with the *liturgy*. In the liturgy, we enter into Christ's own prayer to the Father. We receive Christ's forgiveness in the sacrament of Penance, and we are made present to the sacrifice of Calvary in the Celebration of Mass. During this Lenten season, challenge yourself to see liturgy as the bridge which leads us back to paradise. The old Adam forfeited the gifts of grace given to him by God. The new Adam, Jesus, wins for us the possibility of returning to a state of friendship with God. This whole dynamic of the Christian life is encapsulated in our liturgical and spiritual life as a parish community.
