# IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH: THOUGHT FOR \$\frac{2}{3}\$ THE WEEK \*

In today's gospel, Jesus takes Peter, James and John and brings them up a mountain, where he is transfigured before

them. In the scriptural tradition, the mountain is the place of encounter with the divine. Jesus, on the mountain, reveals himself to his apostles in his full glory, to assure them of his divinity, and to prepare them for the suffering and hardship they would endure. The liturgy has the same effect in our lives. Entering the church is like ascending the mountain, going up and away from all the distractions that compete for our attention. Just like the apostles, we are met on the mountain by the prophets and patriarchs, who tell us the story of God's love for his people. In the Mass, we meet them in the scriptures which are proclaimed in our And the climax of our mountain-top experience is the full glory of Christ revealed to us: truly present yet hidden under the appearance of bread and wine. Each week, we ascend the mountain, but do we allow ourselves to be transfigured? Do we leave the mountain committed to serve this Jesus whose divinity shines through humble signs? Are we transformed through our encounter with him? Do we desire to "pitch our tents" on the mountain, and stay a while in prayer and reflection, or do we hurry away, already anticipating the next distraction? The challenge of liturgy is to climb the mountain, be transfigured with Christ, and descend in order to face the hardships of life with minds and hearts renewed.


