IN SPIRIT AND TRUTH: THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK We find in today's gospel (from the fourth chanter of

(from the fourth chapter of Saint John's gospel) one of the most striking dialogues in the entire bible. At the


beginning of the dialogue, Jesus and the woman seem to be speaking on two different levels. The woman wants to talk about water in buckets while Jesus wants to talk about the water of grace he desires to shower upon her soul. When the conversation turns to the topic of authentic worship, interestingly enough, Jesus brings up the woman's past life of sin and brokenness. The implication is clear: the Father desires us to worship him in spirit and in truth, but this requires an honest inventory of our lives. We cannot authentically worship God unless we first allow his grace to heal, forgive and transform us. During this holy season of Lent, God invites us to return to his grace through the sacrament of penance, so that we may worship him with clear minds, hearts and consciences. Just like the woman at the well, Jesus wants to fill our souls with the water of his healing grace, but our buckets must first be emptied of anything that is preventing us from receiving that grace in abundance. Lent is a time to return: to return to authentic worship, to return to God's healing love in the sacrament of penance.

LONGING TO RETURN: THE GRACE OF FORGIVENESS

Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Confession (Reconciliation) to heal sin and to restore us to friendship with God and the Church. The Church requires that we confess our serious sins at least once a year (Canon 989) and recommends that we confess our venial sins as well (Canon 988). If you have been away from the Sacrament for some time, the Church has only one admonition for you: *do not be afraid!* Jesus is waiting to heal you, to unburden you of whatever is holding you back from experiencing a relationship with him in abundance. Lent is like Spring-cleaning for the soul! If you are unsure of what to confess or how to confess, take a copy of the pamphlet, "How to Make a Good Confession" which is available at the side door. Lent is a time for the giving up of what we are for what we might become!

THE CONFESSIONAL/RECONCILIATION ROOM...

...is located to the right of the altar in Saint Francis Church. It is equipped with a kneeler and a screen for those who wish to confess anonymously, as well as a chair for those who wish to confess face-to-face. The Act of Contrition is also available. If the door is open, the priest is available. Be certain to close the door when you enter, and to leave it open for the next person when you exit!
