From the Pastor...

This weekend we had the privilege of welcoming Bishop Thomas J. Tobin to St. Francis Parish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for forty-four of our young people. We offer our congratulations to them and pray that they will be open to the guidance and strength of the Holy Spirit as they continue their lives of faith. A special word of thanks to Diane Castro, our Confirmation Program Coordinator, as well as all the teachers who worked with these students during their time of preparation for this sacrament. Teaching the faith to the next generation is a very challenging but important ministry of the Church and we pray that the seeds that have been planted will continue to grow and bear much fruit in the lives of these young Catholic Christians.

I would also like to point out that next Sunday, March 17, at the Noon Mass, two adults of our parish will also receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Jacqueline Pagel will be formally received into the Church and will be Confirmed along with Kelly Burnham. Both Jacqueline and Kelly have been preparing under the direction of Deacon Paul Iacono since last Fall. Please join me in praying for them as they complete their formal initiation into the Catholic Church.

On a different note, one of the pillars of Lenten observance is giving alms. One of the great opportunities that we have to do this each year is the diocesan Catholic Charity Appeal. Due to the inclement weather on a couple consecutive weekends, we got off to a slow start, however I am very grateful to those who have already submitted their donation or pledge. Every donation, large or small, is important to the success of the Appeal. Our parish goal this year is \$103,000 – and we could easily exceed that goal if we had 100% participation from our parish community.
