
From the Pastor...

After attending the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, plan on staying for a short time with the Blessed Sacrament in Helen A guide for reflection will be Bouchard Hall. provided for those who wish to stay for prayer. You are encouraged to then visit the other churches in our area, as well, for a brief period of silent prayer and adoration. If you'd rather go home immediately after Mass, you are welcome to return to Helen Bouchard Hall for adoration later in the evening. The hall will remain open for adoration until **11:00PM**. Please plan on spending some time on Holy Thursday in adoration of our Blessed Lord.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy will be prayed at 2:50PM and the afternoon will conclude with the Celebration of Mass at 3:00PM, the hour of mercy.


Annual Easter Egg Hunt

Holy Week is the climax of the entire liturgical year. Today, **Palm Sunday** marks the beginning of the Holy Week, when we commemorate Christ's royal entry into Jerusalem.

On Monday evening, our parish priests will gather with the Most Reverend Bishop at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul in Providence





to participate in the **Chrism Mass**. During this special Mass, all of the priests of our diocese will renew their priestly promises before the bishop and will receive the newly blessed oils for use throughout the coming year (the Oil of Catechumens, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Sacred Chrism).

On Holy Thursday, Lent ends and the **Sacred Triduum** begins. The Sacred Triduum, the three sacred days marking the final events of our Lord's earthly life, forms the core of Holy Week.

On Holy Thursday evening, we will celebrate the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** at **7:00PM** in St. Francis Church. This special Mass commemorates the institution of the Holy Eucharist and the Ministerial Priesthood. At the conclusion of the Mass, the Blessed Sacrament is carried in procession to the "repository" which is located in Helen Bouchard Hall, where adoration will continue until **11:00PM**. Meanwhile, the altar is stripped of its appointments, as a remembrance of Christ's being stripped of his garments.

On Good Friday, we recall with great solemnity the death of Jesus on the cross. **Stations of the Cross** will be prayed at **3:00PM** in St. Francis Church. This is the only day of the year that Mass is not celebrated! The **Celebration of the Lord's Passion** will be held at two different times this year: first at **3:00PM** at St. Romuald Chapel and again at **7:00PM** in St. Francis Church. This distinctive service, which is *not* a Mass, contains the familiar Veneration of the Cross and the distribution of Holy Communion.

On Holy Saturday, the most sacred night of the year, we will gather at **8:00PM (please note change in time)** in Saint Francis Church for the **Easter Vigil**, the mother of all vigils, when we watch for Christ's resurrection. This Mass begins in total darkness with the blessing of the Easter Fire and the lighting of the Easter Candle. We hear several readings, retelling us the story of our salvation and the mighty power of God's work in the course of the world's history. All present will renew their baptismal vows.
