From the Pastor

A clarification about something from last weekend's bulletin: There was a notice about applying for aid if you have a child in Catholic school, and since it was written in the first person singular, it looked as though it came from me. It didn't. It was cut from another source and pasted there before I had a chance to see it. Nevertheless, it did reflect something I've thought myself and also have heard from other pastors: parishes are no longer willing to hand out money to families who claim they need help to send their children to Catholic school but who are not bringing them up as practicing Catholics. So I agree: if you're not willing to come to Mass weekly and to support the parish financially to the extent that you're able, please do not ask us for tuition assistance. On the other hand, we are more than willing to help send to Catholic schools the children of families who are willing to practice the faith by coming to Mass, the minimum expected of us all. In fact, we encourage families to consider Catholic education.

Last weekend we held one of our biannual pre-Cana sessions. This is a diocesan program, held at various parishes around the state, to help prepare couples for marriage in the Catholic Church. I am happy to say that the one held here is staffed almost completely by couples from this parish, with exception of one couple from Charlestown who belong to Christ the King parish. I am further glad to say that we have three younger couples from this parish who are interested in being part of the pre-Cana team. Thus, of the eight couples giving the talks, seven are from our parish. It's very encouraging to see. God bless them!

FORGIVE

Jesus asks us to forgive others in the same way that we have received forgiveness from God. When we forgive, we release the poison of resentment that builds up inside of us. Forgiveness is an act of mercy for ourselves as well as for the person who hurt us.




