From the Pastor...

We have begun the Season of Lent and I hope that everyone has looked over our parish Lenten brochure and identified opportunities for spiritual growth during this time of grace.

Next weekend we look forward to welcoming Father Austin Dominic Litke, O.P., a Dominican Father who serves at New York University and St. Joseph's Parish in Greenwich Village, New York. Father Austin will preach at all the weekend Masses at the church and introduce the Lenten Mission that he will offer on the following Monday through Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM. On Monday evening, March 17, he will lead a Mission Service with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, on Tuesday evening he will preach and we will have our Parish Lenten Penance Service. We will have several priests available for confessions. On Wednesday evening the Mission will conclude with a Lenten Mass. The theme of the Mission will be: "And These Three Remain: Faith, Hope and Charity in Christian Life." I hope that many parishioners will join us for this Mission. If you can't make it to all three nights, you are still encouraged to participate when you can.

For those who don't like to venture out in the evening, I would like to highlight two new Lenten offerings this year. On Sunday mornings at 9:00 AM members of our Parish Retreat Team will offer a series entitled: Coffee and Cameos. A light breakfast will be offered along with a reflection on one of the several interesting personalities who make "cameo" appearances in the Gospel accounts of the Lord's Passion and Death. This will be a great way to prepare for Holy Week by reflecting on the Crucifixion from a different perspective. Another daytime offering during this season will be the Stations of the Cross on Wednesday's at 12:30 PM at St. Romuald's Chapel. Please check our Parish Lenten Brochure and Calendar for more details about these and other Lenten opportunities.

On a different note, one of the pillars of Lenten observance is giving alms. We have a great opportunity to do this each year through the diocesan Catholic Charity Appeal. I am very grateful to those who have already submitted their donation or pledge. Every donation, large or small, is important to the success of the Appeal. Our parish goal this year is \$103,070 – and we could easily exceed that goal if we had 100% participation from our parish community. If you have not already done so, please prayerfully consider a gift that will assist many people throughout the State of Rhode Island.

THE SIGHTS AND SOUNDS OF LENT

Our worship spaces now reflect the starkness of the Lenten season. Flowers and greens will have no place by the altar and even unbleached candles, used in past centuries throughout the penitential seasons, will make an appearance in the sanctuaries of our church and chapel. At St. Francis Church, a special crucifixhandcrafted by parishioner Peter Spaine and beautifully painted by **Deacon Iacono**—will accompany us throughout Lent and will be venerated by our parish community on Good Friday. Also in St. Francis, striking wreaths made of simple branches and pussy willow—masterfully crafted by Elaine Godfrey of Weedweavers in Wakefield—convey a sense of the barrenness of the season. Simple earthenware—handmade by local artist Thomas Ladd—will also make an appearance at both St. Francis and St. Romuald. Even our singing will reflect the solemn tone of the season. These signs, sounds and symbols are meant to foster a deeper sense of prayer and conversion as we pray for the grace of Christ to arise in us!
