From the Pastor

Each week I go to South County Hospital to visit any of our parishioners who might be there. The hospital kindly provides a list of Catholics usually around two dozen or so—by parish. It frequently happens that I'd like to check back with one or another patient to see how they're making out after their discharge but when I go to our Parish Data System I find that I cannot contact them because, although they claim St. Francis as their parish, and indeed live within our borders, they have never registered with us.

I would ask and urge everyone who considers himself or herself a parishioner to call the rectory, preferably in the morning after 7:30, when the volunteer help is here, and register with us. If you're not sure whether you're already registered or not, ask yourself if you ever get mailings from St. Francis parish. If you don't, you're not registered.
