The Grace of the Rejected Stone

God, who loves us, and who himself has experienced the mystery of suffering, does not take lightly our cries of pain or our feeling that there is something wrong with it all, that it shouldn't be this way, that we are wounded.

I have cried out to God, "Why, O Lord, did you put me in a world full of persons and things that are good and beautiful and fill me with aspirations to accomplish things—good things, things that would give you glory? Why did you sow these desires in my heart and then let me fall into this cage? Why must I endure this debility when my heart yearns not to do evil but to embrace the good and affirm your glory?"

I think that the experience of suffering challenges us to go one step further if our hearts are to begin to learn that God really loves us here and now, personally and completely, that he loves the whole of us, and that this life is not just a game.

In reality created things are good. Life is good. My life is good. Jesus knew this: No man has ever known so profoundly what a marvelous and wonderful thing it is to live! If all we say about suffering is, "I guess I have to have it bad now so that I can have it good in heaven," I do not think we have said enough. The human heart is not satisfied with this. ... It is good to live, to be treated with justice, kindness, and dignity, to flourish as a human being. The physical and earthly needs of the human person and human society are a concern of the Church because they, too, are the object of God's mercy.

God wants to comfort us in our afflictions and console us in our sorrows, but above all he wants to teach our hearts that he is with us always. He wants to open our hearts to the experience of something that we cannot perceive by ourselves: that the realities of our daily life mean more—not less—than we understand.

Affordable Housing Applications

Meadowbrook II Apartments & Peace Dale Estates are now accepting applications for their facilities. Peace Dale House is a housing facility for low income elderly who are age 62 years or older and/or disabled individuals of any age. There are two buildings of two stories with 16 apartments in each for a total of 32 apartments. The average size is 530 square feet.

Meadowbrook has ten 2 bedroom and two 3 bedroom apartments that are accessible, with rental assistance subsidy for applicants meeting income limits established under the RHS Low Income program. Qualified applicants pay 30% of their adjusted income for rent at both Meadowbrook and Peace Dale Estates.


